MY KAMAJI MEMORIES

The day after camp ended, my sister Vivian and I found ourselves in Minneapolis with a few days before we began our journey home. For those days we had only one concrete plan: a visit to the Mall of America's Croc Store. Upon arrival, we made our way through the maze of designer stores and chain restaurants before spotting the iconic green letters. Once in the store, we carefully selected our pairs: a new sky blue pair for me as my old tie-dyed ones had become worn through years of use and a dark purple pair for her - her first pair! Then came the most thrilling part - picking out our Jibbitz. If you are unfamiliar with libbitz, they are essentially small pieces of rubber that depict different objects or characters and fit perfectly into the holes of Crocs, which adds a little personality and flair. We carefully selected a few real Jibbitz - ones made by the Croc brand - before heading out of the store to a nearby kiosk that had bins filled with hundreds of "fakes" - knock-off Jibbitz. Past me would be so incredibly confused. Crocs? Jibbitz? Before camp, Crocs were nothing more than comfortable slip-ons. But now they hold a new meaning. These bedazzled shoes bring me back to camp. To the rows of Croc-adorned feet dangling from the dining hall porch waiting patiently for the bell to ring. To the excitement of coming across a lost Jibbit on the stone steps. And of course to nights in Cocoon showcasing and trading the Jibbitz my girls had gained that day although no new treasure could top Josie's light-up peace sign or Lily's army of Minions. To me, Crocs have become one of the many metaphors for camp – objects and ideas that have no real meaning but take on a new life at camp – a piece of my Kamaji story. Throughout my seven summers at camp, hundreds of things have gained significance. Speaking of the Canadian, the sweatshirt that I gained at the end of the journey, though just a piece of clothing etched with the name of an unknown town to all others, is a constant reminder to me not only of this accomplishment but of the memories made in the Canadian wilderness. Fruit loops will always be eaten by color, onesies are the perfect outfit for any occasion, and of course, no pine tree will ever be as grand as those in the North Woods. Each of these objects conjure fragmented stories that, pieced together, create the memories of camp that I hold so dear. I have held these memories tight as the years slip by. As I prepare to graduate from college this spring and begin the next phase of my life, these memories will serve as a source of comfort; a reminder of the place that shaped me into the confident person I have become. And though these memories may fade, as the Council Fire song has reminded us time and time again, they will never ever die.
